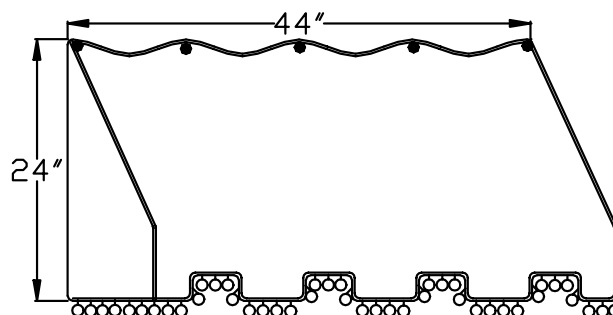




ERIN VALANCE

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- This charming awning valance can be adapted to fit various window widths. The finished length of the valance is approximately 24 inches in length and projects out from the wall about 7 1/2".



- This valance works best when constructed out of a medium-weight decorative fabric. The valance works best when lined in a contrasting solid color fabric to prevent white lining from showing to the front side.
- Use a drapery interlining to give the valance the best body and shape. Interlining is a flannel-like cotton fabric that hangs between the face fabric and the lining. It is available in white and natural colors and can be found at most decorative fabric stores or at www.patemeadows.com. It is *not* the same thing as interfacing.
- The valance shown in the photograph is attached to the wall using decorative knobs (available at www.patemeadows.com).
- Instructions are included for constructing a PVC frame for the bottom of the valance.

MATERIALS

These amounts are for a valance measuring 44" wide finished. See chart below for other window widths. These amounts are based on 54" wide fabric.

Fabrics & Trims:

- 1 1/2 yards of decorative fabric for face*
- 1 1/2 yards of decorative contrasting fabric for lining
- 1 1/2 yards of drapery interlining (www.patemeadows.com)
- 1 1/2 yards of fabric to cover piping
- 2 1/2 yards of decorative trim for bottom of valance (optional)

Supplies

- Temporary fabric marker
- Hacksaw
- 5 ft. of 3/4" Schedule 40 PVC
- Two 3/4" x 3/4" x 3/4" PVC 90° elbows
- Two 3/4" PVC end caps (not threaded)
- Two 1 1/4" drywall screws
- Double-sided tape
- Push pins
- 8 yards of 6/32"-diameter cotton piping
- 1/4" grommets & grommet tool (buttonholes may be substituted)
- 5 decorative knobs (www.patemeadows.com)

**These amounts are based on 54" wide fabric. Allow extra fabric to match patterns and plaids.*

***For multiple valances, a total of 2 yards fabric for piping is usually sufficient.*
