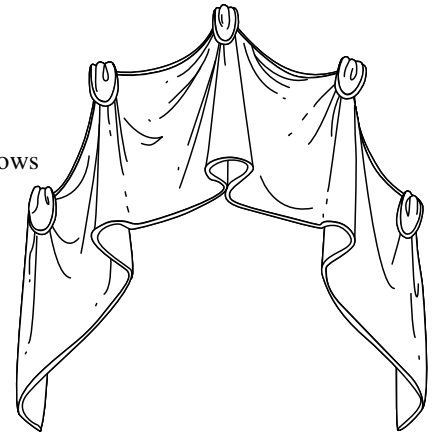




HALEY VALANCE

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- This fully lined, arched valance trimmed with piping can be adapted to fit arch windows from 30" wide to 90" wide across the base of the arch. Our instructions fit a standard true arch window (38" to 42" wide at the base), and include the information needed to add to or reduce the width. This valance could be used on eyebrow and elliptical shaped windows also. The finished length of the valance is approximately 19" at the center and 26" at the sides.
- This valance works best when constructed out of a medium-weight decorative fabric.
- Use a drapery interlining to give the valance the best body and shape. Interlining is a flannel-like cotton fabric that hangs between the face fabric and the lining. It is available in white and natural colors and can be found at most decorative fabric stores or at www.patemeadows.com. It is **not** the same thing as interfacing.
- We attached our valance to the wall using knobs and post adapters available at www.patemeadows.com. You can use simple wardrobe hooks as an alternative. The gathered horns on our valance are tied chair-tie tassels. However raffia or ribbon could be used.



MATERIALS

These amounts are for a true arch window measuring 38" to 42" at the base. See chart below for other window widths. These amounts are based on 54" wide fabric.

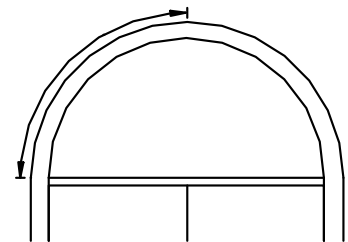
Fabrics:

- 2 ½ yards of decorative fabric for valance front*
- 2 ½ yards of fabric that contrasts with decorative fabric, for valance back.
- [2 ½ yards of drapery interlining \(www.patemeadows.com\)](http://www.patemeadows.com)
- 1 ½ yards of fabric to cover piping (we used the same fabric as for the valance back)
- [9 yards of 4/32"-diameter cotton piping \(www.patemeadows.com\)](http://www.patemeadows.com)
- [5 knobs & post adapters \(www.patemeadows.com\) or wardrobe hooks](http://www.patemeadows.com)
- 5 chair tie tassels, raffia or ribbon
- Optional trim along bottom edge – 3 ¾ yards

Supplies:

- Temporary fabric marker (www.patemeadows.com)

To figure yardage, measure ½ of the arch area of your window. Refer to chart below for yardage requirements. Figuring for ½ of the arch instead of the entire window insures a bracket at the center of the arch.



YARDAGE FOR OTHER WINDOW WIDTHS

½ of Arch	Face fabric*, contrast fabric, interlining	Fabric to cover Piping**	4/32" cotton piping	Hooks/tassels	Optional Trim
24-39	2 ½ yds	1 ½ yds**	9 yds	5	3 ¾ yds
40-55	3 ¼ yds	1 ½ yds**	12 yds	7	5 ¼ yds
56-71	4 yds	1 ½ yds**	15 yds	9	6 ¾ yds

* *These amounts are based on 54" wide fabric. Allow extra fabric to match patterns and plaids.*

** *For multiple valances, a total of 2 yards for piping is usually sufficient.*
