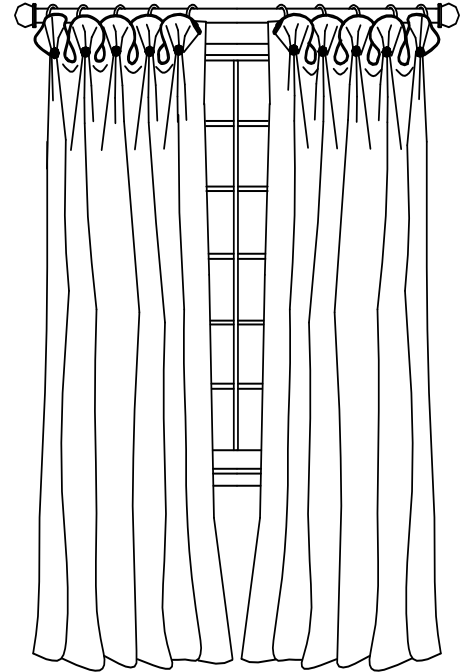




JULIE ANNE PANELS

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- These stylish curtains are great to use as decorative side panels. They are non-workable and each side panel covers about 18-20" of space. The side panels consist of 1-1/2 width of fabric each.
- Trim can be applied to the leading edge of the panels, if desired. We added a small brush fringe to the top of the panels in place of the covered piping.
- The length of the panels can be adapted to any length.
- When drapery interlining is used, the curtains hang beautifully with a luxurious look. Interlining is a flannel-like cotton fabric that hangs between the face fabric and the lining. It is available in white and natural colors and can be found at most decorative fabric stores or at www.patemeadows.com. It is *not* the same thing as interfacing.



MATERIALS

These instructions are for one pair of panels. Each side panel consists of 1-1/2 widths of 54"-wide fabric. The finished width of each panel is approximately 18-20" depending on how far apart you place the rings when installing the panels. . The finished length of this pattern is 90" but can be adjusted.

Fabrics for one pair of curtains 90" long:

- 9 yards of 54"-wide decorative fabric for face fabric
- 1/2 yard of decorative fabric for facings (this can be the same as the face fabric or contrasting fabric)
- [7 1/4 yards of 54"-wide drapery interlining *](#)
- [8 yards of 54"-wide lining - ivory or white *](#)
- 1 1/2 yards for piping along top edge –OR–
- 4 1/2 yards small brush fringe across top (optional)

Supplies:

- [4 1/2 yards of 4/32" cotton piping *](#)
- [Steam-a-Seam2 – 1/2" *](#)
- [Temporary fabric marker *](#)
- [10 cover-your-own buttons – 7/8" or 1-1/8" diameter*](#)
- 10 drapery pins 1-1/2 long
- 4 covered drapery weights
- Decorative rod with brackets, finials & 10 rings
