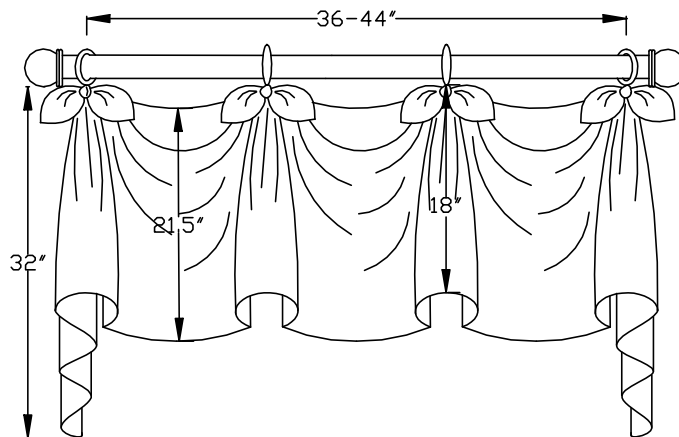




MARLEY VALANCE

- This unique valance is a casual take on a formal style and can be adapted to fit any size window by adding additional swag sections. Our instructions are for a valance that is 36-44" finished width. The information needed to add to or reduce the width is included. The finished length of the valance is approximately 21 1/2" at the swag, 18" at the middle jabot and 32" at the side jabots. The jabots are lined in a contrasting fabric. A facing made with decorative fabric is used along the bottom edge of the swag lining so that ivory/white lining does show to the front.



- This valance works best when constructed out of a medium-weight decorative fabric.
- Use a drapery interlining to give the valance the best body and shape. Interlining is a flannel-like cotton fabric that hangs between the face fabric and the lining. It is available in white and natural colors and can be found at most decorative fabric stores or at www.patemeadows.com. It is **not** the same thing as interfacing.
- We mounted our valance on a wooden rod with rings.

MATERIALS

These amounts are for a valance measuring 36-44" finished, installed width. See chart for other widths. **These amounts are based on 54" wide fabric.**

Fabrics:

- 2 1/2 yards of decorative fabric for valance front*
- 3/4 yards fabric for ties
- 1 1/2 yards of contrasting fabric for lining of jabots and facings for horns and swags
- [1 1/2 yards of lining \(www.patemeadows.com\)](http://www.patemeadows.com)
- [2 1/2 yards of drapery interlining \(www.patemeadows.com\)](http://www.patemeadows.com)
- 1 1/2 yards fabric to cover piping

Supplies:

- Temporary fabric marker (www.patemeadows.com)
- [Steam-A-Seam²® - 1/2" or other iron-on adhesive \(www.patemeadows.com\)](http://www.patemeadows.com)
- [4 - 8" electrical cable ties \(www.patemeadows.com\)](http://www.patemeadows.com)
- 4 1/2 yards trim for bottom of valance (optional)
- [4 1/2 yards of 4/32" cotton piping \(www.patemeadows.com\)](http://www.patemeadows.com)

*Allow extra fabric for matching of patterned fabric

*These amounts are based on 54" wide fabric. Allow extra fabric to match patterns and plaids. These amounts are based on unaltered swag sections (A).

**For multiple valances, a total of 1 1/2 to 2 yards fabric for piping is usually sufficient.
