

Poplar Grove Panels

GENERAL NOTES

- This pattern was used as a shower curtain but could be used for side panels on a window. These panels are non-workable and should be used strictly as decorative side panels
- The length of the panels can be adapted to any length
- The valance works best when made from a medium-weight decorative fabric.
- A small flange of contrasting fabric is used along the top and in the pleats at the bottom of the panels
- Use a drapery interlining (available at most home decorative stores) to give the panels the best body and shape.
- The panels in the picture are mounted on an iron rod with iron rings, but any type of decorative pole can be used.
- This pattern is figured with no pattern repeat. Please allow extra fabric if your fabric has a pattern that needs to be matched.

MATERIALS

*These instructions are for one pair of panels. The finished width of each of the side panels is approximately 25" when flat, and approximately 18-20" when installed. 1 ½ widths of fabric is used for each panel. The finished length of this pattern is 90" but can be adjusted. **These amounts are based on 54" wide fabric.***

For Panels up to 90" long:

Fabrics:

- 10 yards of decorative fabric*
- 3 yards of contrasting fabric for flange, buttons and pleat insert
- 7 ½ yards drapery lining (ivory or white)
- 6 ¾ yards of drapery interlining (to add body and shape)

Supplies

- Temporary fabric maker
- 4 ft. pole with rings and finials
- Drapery pins
- 30 cover-your-own buttons size 24
- 2 ½ yds of 3"-wide 3-cord shirring tape

**These amounts are based on 54" wide fabric. Allow extra fabric for matching patterns or repeats.*
