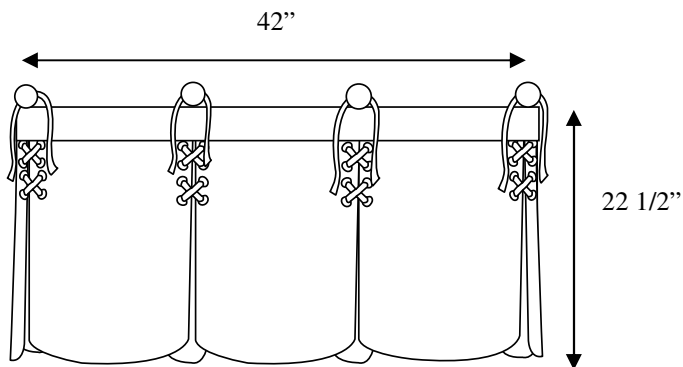




LACE-UP VALANCE

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- This fully lined and interlined, valance with mock pleats and lace-up ties can be adapted to fit any window width. The finished length of the valance is approximately 22 1/2" in length.



- This valance works best when constructed out of a medium-weight to heavy weight decorative fabric. The valance is self-lined to prevent white lining from showing to the front side.
- The mock pleats are made using a contrasting fabric. The ties and piping are also out of a contrasting fabric.
- Use a drapery interlining to give the valance the best body and shape. Interlining is a flannel-like cotton fabric that hangs between the face fabric and the lining. It is available in white and natural colors and can be found at most decorative fabric stores or at www.patemeadows.com. It is *not* the same thing as interfacing. If you are using a heavy-weight fabric, it is probably not necessary to interline.
- The valance shown in the photograph is attached to the wall using decorative knobs with post adapters to project the valance away from the wall. These products are available at www.patemeadows.com. The pattern allows for a 3 1/2" or 5 1/2" return.

MATERIALS

*These amounts are for a valance measuring 42" wide finished. See chart below for other window widths. **These amounts are based on 54" wide fabric.***

Fabrics:

- 2 yards of decorative fabric for main fabric*
- 3/4 yard of decorative contrasting fabric for mock pleats
- [1 1/4 yards of drapery interlining \(www.patemeadows.com\)](http://www.patemeadows.com)
- 1 1/2 yard of decorative fabric for ties & piping

Supplies

- [Temporary fabric marker \(www.patemeadows.com\)](http://www.patemeadows.com)
- [4 decorative knobs \(www.patemeadows.com\)](http://www.patemeadows.com)
- [4 post adapters \(www.patemeadows.com\)](http://www.patemeadows.com)
- 1/4" grommets & tool (buttonholes may be substituted)

**These amounts are based on 54" wide fabric. Allow extra fabric to match patterns and plaids.*

***For multiple windows, you should be able to get all ties and piping out of 1 1/2 - 2 yards total.*
